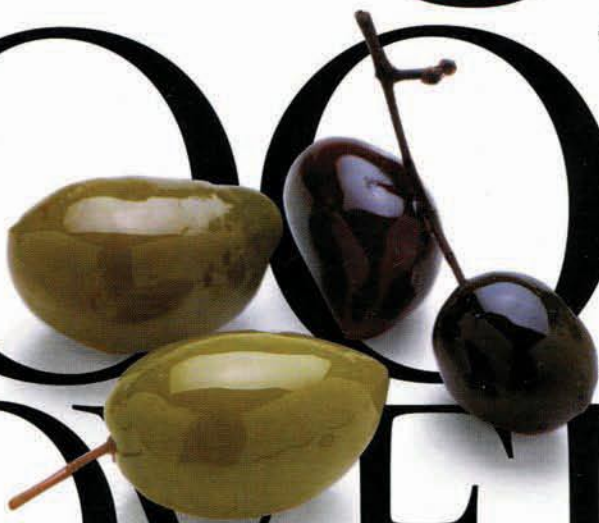

INTENDED TO FEEL like the interior of a jewelry box, the Powder Room was designed by Kristine Kamenstein of Jackson Paige Interiors. Kristine fulfilled her aim and used environmentally friendly products without compromising her desire for an elegant and sophisticated space. "I decided on a total emersion of glass and stone—two materials that can be harvested without harm to our environment," she says. "In addition, I chose accessories that emulated nature's beauty: coral and twig-like polished nickel sconces, an Eames walnut stool, Origins bath products, and a Jado faucet which emits water in a clean, clear, waterfall-simulated flow."
